- sympathy (noun): feelings of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune
- synthetic (adj.): prepared or made artificially
- symptom (noun): a noticeable change in the body or its functions that indicates the presence of a disease or other disorder
- symposium (noun): a formal meeting where experts discuss a particular topic
- symmetry (noun): the quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis
- symbiosis (noun): a mutually beneficial relationship between different people or groups
- synthesize (verb): to make something by combining different things (such as styles, ideas, etc.)
- synonym (noun): a word that has the same meaning as another word in the same language
- syndicate (noun): a group of companies with a singular common interest
- synagogue (noun): a building designated as a space for people of the Jewish faith to worship within
- synchronize (verb): happen at the same time
- synergy (noun): the working together of two things to produce an effect greater than the sum of their individual effects

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
